Fifty years or more later, I took a writing class. The teacher, on hearing my tale of woe, told me to stop trying to write the “old story” and to focus on writing something “new” and just start by writing what came spontaneously.

I did that and the log jam with the old story broke open to something new. The “new,” however, was triggered by a dream. From the dream I learned that what I was to write was titled, *DREAMS: The Final Heresy*. It was the dream’s idea, but I took it seriously and found that the writing began to flow.

I have not quite finished the first draft, but it is currently 500 pages in length. I am going to begin posting completed chapters and would welcome any comments you might have, particularly answering the question, “Do you want to continue reading.”

A second novel, also prompted by a dream, is entitled, *The Rule of Three*. In the dream, I saw the title page with this title and a subtitle, *An Arlan Condon Mystery*.
