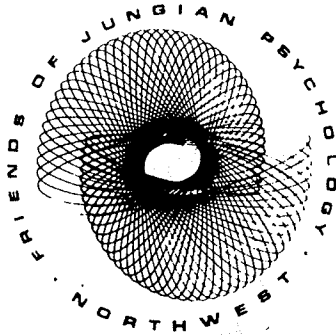

JUNG'S PSYCHOLOGICAL TYPES

Joseph B. Wheelwright, M.D., Clinical Professor Emeritus of Psychiatry San Francisco, is widely known as one of the most distinguished Jungian analysts in the U.S. and one of the first and most important in establishing Jungian Psychology in this country. Dr. Wheelwright is co-author with Horace Gray of the "Jungian Type Survey" ("Gray-Wheelwright test"), a test that is being used by many researchers in and out of universities in this country and abroad.
