OCTOBER 1 TWO SEMINARS WITH JOHN H. LANEY

10:00 a.m. PEYOTE ORIGIN LEGENDS: An analysis of origin legends of the Native American Church from a Jungian viewpoint
1:30 p.m.

The Native American Church of North America, also known as the peyote movement, arose during the past century among the reservation Indians of the United States and has become the single most influential religious force among them. John Laney will discuss examples of stories told about the beginnings of the religion. Following the lectures, he and his wife, Edith Laney, who has shared his experience, will present a sample of the peyote music, and some of the ceremonial equipment will be introduced and shown. Mr. Laney has recommended that those attending his seminars read one of his articles on the subject. Copies of his 25-page article (\$1.00) will be available at St. Stephen's at 9:15 a.m.

John H. Laney is an analytical psychologist, diplomate of the C. G. Jung Institute, Zurich. He has a background in clinical psychology and has practiced psychotherapy in the San Diego area for twenty years. His personal experience includes many years of ceremonial participation and friendship with the Indians of this movement.
