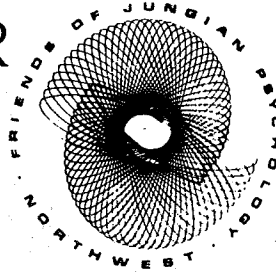

WHAT IS TRUTH?

Laura Cameron Fraser, Th.D., associate rector, The Episcopal Church of the Epiphany, Seattle, will explore the relationship between an individual's psychological development and his theological understandings. Erich

Neumann traces a kind of organic series of stages of development in the human psyche. In her dissertation, called The Tao, Dr. Fraser relates these stages to corresponding ways man structures his conceptions of the gods, the universe, sexual roles, human value. It leaves us less naive about our and man's conceptual systems--for each mirrors its owner's psychic structure to a startling extent. A particular individual will recognize "eternal verities" in a particular religion or philosophical system because it institutionalizes and universalizes his interior verities. An understanding of this is invaluable to some degree of objectivity in self-understanding.

"In The Ring there are at least five interwoven strands of overt meaning concerned with German nationalism, international socialism, the philosophy of Schopenhauer, Buddhism, and Christianity....On another level, there is a prophetic treatment of some of the themes of psychoanalysis: power complex arising from sexual inhibition; incest; mother fixation; and Oedipus complex."
