This seminar will be an elaboration upon the paper Bill presented at the Eighth International Congress for Analytical Psychology in San Francisco in September. It will be concerned with: the psychology of feasts and feasting, mutuality as a psychological motive, ego and self, and feeling and emotion. Illustrative materials will be drawn from literature, analytic practice, and everyday life.

Dr. Willeford is Associate Professor of English and Comparative Literature, University of Washington; psychotherapist and Jungian analyst. Graduate of the C.G. Jung Institute, Zurich; Founding Member of the International Society of Jungian Analysts. Author of The Fool and his Scepter: An Essay in Clowns and Jesters and their Audience (Northwestern University Press, 1969, now almost available in paperback) and numerous articles on psychological and literary subjects.
