**ANTHONY STEVENS:** Archetypes: The New Synthesis.

In their own way, contemporary scientists are discovering the collective unconscious. Archeologists, anthropologists, ethologists and sociobiologists are all collecting data which corroborate the validity of Jung's insights into the crucial role of archetypes in human affairs. This lecture will consider how Jungians may integrate this new evidence, and conversely, how Jungian psychology may contribute to the growth of a new, integrated science of humanity.

**ANTHONY STEVENS M.D.**, is a psychiatrist and analyst practicing in London and Devon. Born and educated in the west of England, he studied psychology and medicine at the University of Oxford. In the mid-1960's he was Research Fellow in Infant Behavior at the Institute of Child Health in Athens, where his work on infant attachment behavior contributed to the genesis of his book, Archetypes: A Natural History of the Self.

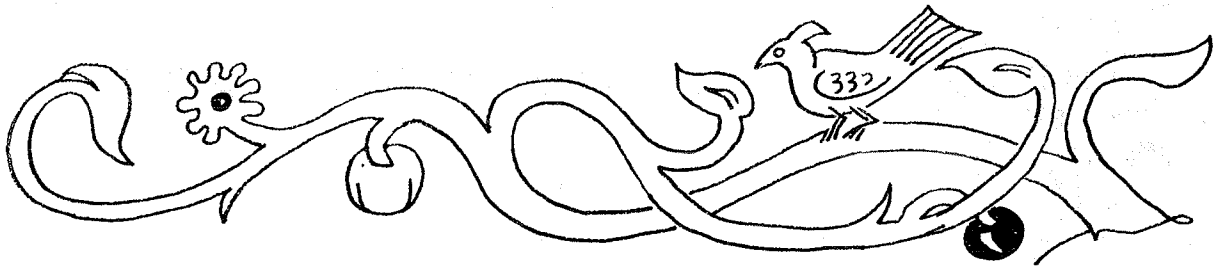

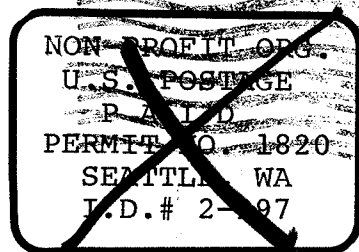
